## Chronological list of publishing dates of Slows works

Note - On one or two pieces the date is assumed from research of the subject matter date, eg: Zam an Zue's visit to the Girt Wheel is handdated 1900 in the WAS Library copy, but the actual Big Wheel existed at Earls Court only in 1896, which one may assume is when the piece must have been written. I have consulted various news clippings to establish a reasonable ordering. Titles written in *italic* denote their appearance in some previous edition.
